



LOUISIANA STATE MUSEUM FIELD TRIPS IN NEW ORLEANS

The Louisiana State Museum offers free field trips at all its locations in New Orleans.
Here's everything you need to know!

Locations

The Louisiana State Museum has 6 locations in New Orleans:

1. The Cabildo – 701 Chartres Street
2. The Presbytère – 751 Chartres Street
3. 1850 House – 523 Saint Ann Street
4. Madame John's Legacy – (closed for restoration)
5. New Orleans Jazz Museum – 400 Esplanade Avenue
6. Louisiana Civil Rights Museum – 900 Convention Center Boulevard, Hall A

Open hours

Tuesdays–Sundays, 9:00 a.m.–4:00 p.m.
Last group entry is at 3:30 p.m.
Closed on state holidays.

Recommended time per visit

At least 1 hour per location is recommended. You may visit multiple locations in one day.

Group size

The maximum group size is 50 people at one time in all locations except the 1850 House, where the limit is 15 people at one time.

Chaperone requirements

A minimum of 1 chaperone for every 10 students is required. The Museum will admit up to 1 free chaperone for every 5 students.

Booking a trip

To request a field trip, complete the online form at: bit.ly/GroupResLSM. Make requests at least two weeks in advance. Your preferred date and time may not be available due to other bookings. You will receive an e-mail confirmation statement and invoice from us when your trip is confirmed.



Cost

Admission is free for K-12 school groups. All other groups of 15 or more (with reservations) receive a 20% discount off our normal admission rate. The Museum will admit up to 1 free chaperone for every 5 students. Additional chaperones will be charged regular adult admission at each location. Payment

If your group incurs charges for additional chaperones, you may pay at the front desk of each location upon arrival. The Museum accepts cash, Visa, Mastercard, and business checks. If you wish to pay advance, please contact Damond Francois, Administrative Program Specialist, at 504.568.6973. Please note that no refunds will be offered for advance payments, even if the number of people on your trip changes.

Parking/Bus Regulations

The Louisiana State Museum does not offer parking. There are many public parking lots in and around the French Quarter. Buses over 31 feet long are not permitted in the French Quarter and buses under 31 feet must use designated streets. Buses may be able to find public street parking on Elysian Fields Avenue. Storage

The Museum does not offer storage for lunch or other belongings.

Guided tours

The Museum partners with the nonprofit organization the Friends of the Cabildo (FOC) to offer guided tours of the Cabildo and 1850 House to school groups on certain days. When you complete the group reservation form, please indicate your interest in a guided tour. The Education Program Coordinator will connect you with the FOC so you may arrange a tour. There is a \$25.00 fee for guided tours.

All other visits at all locations are self-guided.

Accessibility

All exhibition areas of the Cabildo, Presbytère, New Orleans Jazz Museum, and Louisiana Civil Rights

Museum are wheelchair accessible. The historic areas of the 1850 House are not wheelchair accessible. Each location has one wheelchair and limited lightweight stools for visitor use that can be checked out at the front desk. For all other accessibility concerns or requests, please e-mail ktrevino@crt.la.gov at least two weeks in advance of your visit.
